SMSA SEASON CHAMPIONSHIP

All A Level teams that participate in the scrimmage rotation are invited to sail in the SMSA team race championship as listed above. These teams must sail with 2/3rds of what is considered to be there A Team, meaning that only 2 sailors from outside that team can sail in the Champs. Also, the top B Level teams from each Region will be invited to the Championship.

ABOUT THE COACHES

Nick Ewenson has an established team racing resume both as a sailor and as a coach. As a sailor his St. Mary's College of MD team placed 1st & 2nd at the Intercollegiate Team Race Nationals. Since graduating he has competed at the international level of team racing and his team also finished 3rd at the US Team Racing Championships for the Hinman Trophy. Nick is also a coach at the College of Charleston. He has been an integral part of developing a consistently top-ranked team in the country.

Amanda Callahan is a World Champion team racer on the Silver Panda team. Her team has also won the US & UK Team Racing Championships multiple times. She is a team racing expert but, as she predominantly crews, has the advantage of knowing what it takes to be best in the front of the boat. Amanda is the Head Sailing Coach at the nationally-ranked Roger Williams University. Under her guidance, the team qualified for, and placed 4th in, their first ICSA Dinghy Championships this year.

Brian Clancy grew up team racing out of Scituate Harbor Yacht and on the Boston College High School Sailing Tea. After that he was active on the National Championship Hobart/William Smith team and was also a on the team race squad which finished 3rd twice on the ICSA National Team Race Championship, earning him All-American status. Since graduating he has coached junior sailing fleet and team racing in addition to recreational team racing on the US circuit.
